Playback trends

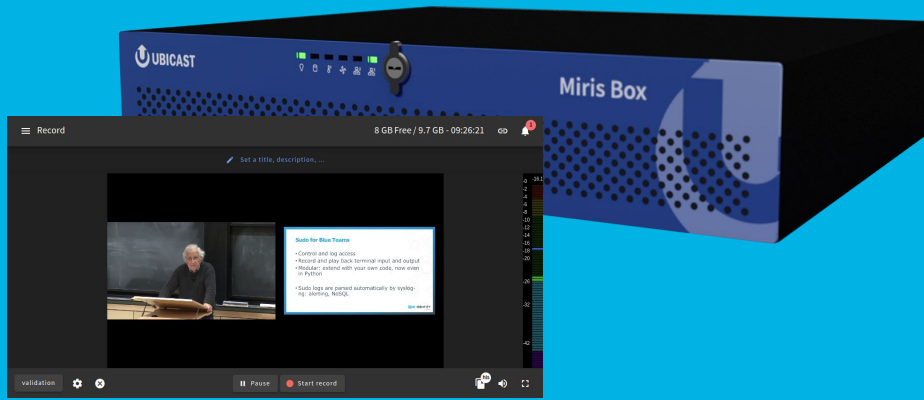


- Mostly plays right after the conference (phoronix / social media announcements ?)

- OpenGL for the gstreamer pipeline

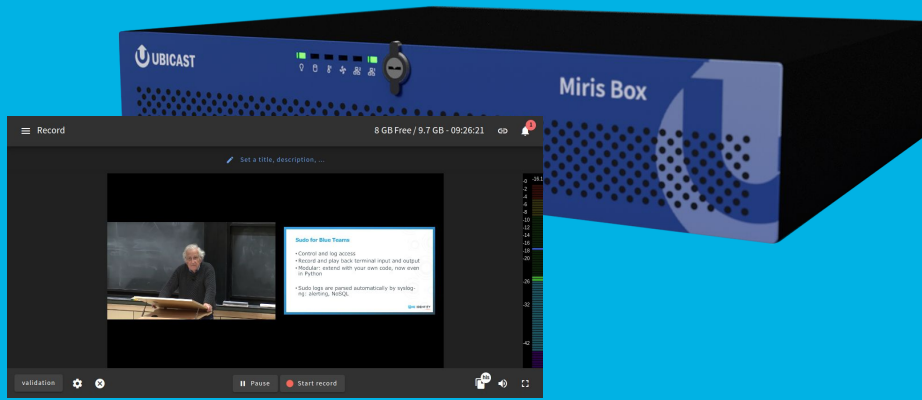
